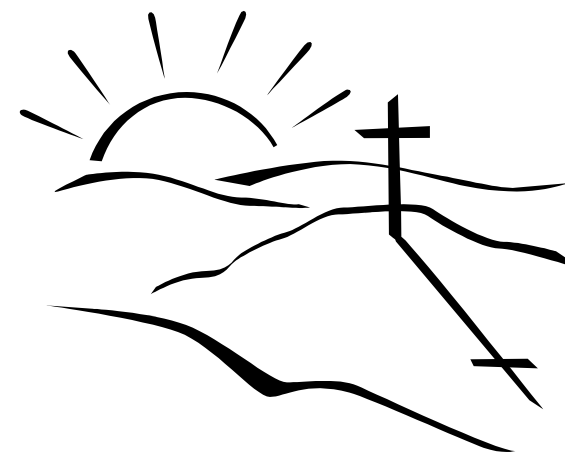

The Sects of The Jews

There were five major parties into which the Jewish people of New Testament times were divided. Let's look at the beliefs and doctrines that these sects hold.

The Pharisees: The Pharisees held the doctrine of foreordination and considered it consistent with the free will of men. They believed in the immortality of the soul, in the resurrection of the body, and in the existence of spirits (angels and demons). They believed that men are rewarded or punished in the future life according as they lived virtuously or viciously in this life. They believed that the souls of the good men become reincarnated in body after body, while the souls of the wicked are detained forever in everlasting punishment in prison under the earth.

The Sadducees: In opposition to the Pharisees, who laid great stress on the traditions of the elders, the Sadducees limited their creed to the doctrines which they could find in the sacred text itself. They held that the written Law of Moses alone was binding. They maintained the right of private interpretation. In distinction to the Pharisees, the Sadducees denied the resurrection and future retribution in Sheol, asserting that the soul dies with the body. They denied the existence of angels or spirits. They denied fatalism, contending for the freedom of the will. Teaching that all our actions are in our own power, so that we ourselves are the causes of what is good and receive what is evil from our own folly, and affirming that God is not concerned in our doing good or not doing what is evil.

The Essenes: They practiced a form of communism (they had all things common). Of course, some "scholars" have attempted to show that Jesus and John the Baptist and the apostles were Essenes. Some of the Essene communities rejected marriage. They did, however, welcome the opportunity to adopt young children who could then be reared in accord with Essene teaching. In work, the Essenes labored as farmers and craftsmen. They would not go to war, or make instruments of war, or engage in commerce. Their discipline was severe and ritualistic. They had long periods of silent meditation and worship. Their various religious observances were strictly kept. They had baptism in sand (each morning they would cover themselves with sand, and watch for the rising of the sun). They had many ceremonial ablutions.

The Herodians: The Herodians were apparently a political party of rich and influential people who were well disposed to the Herodian rule, and consequently also that of the Romans, who supported the Herods. They were on the side of Herod in a land where many people were definitely opposed to that regime.

The Zealots: "Zealot" is the Greek equivalent of the Aramaic "Cananean." This was a Jewish patriotic party—interested in the overthrow of the Roman domination of Palestine. This party was a movement started by Judas the Galilean in the time of Quirinius (Acts 5:37) to resist Roman aggression.
